### LETTER FROM The **Director**



The year, 2022 was truly a year of recovery. Our dedicated volunteers kept KCMT going in the midst and aftermath of COVID so that the youth in our community would have a place to socialize in person and exercise their passions.

Due to COVID, North Kitsap Auditorium was closed in November of 2021 which is when we would have performed *Annie*. Graciously, Gateway Fellowship opened their doors, providing a place for us to perform in January 2022 instead. Twenty-two years earlier, Gateway's Pastor, Marc Pearson encouraged us to follow our dream by starting a children's musical theatre where it could be a blessing to the youth in Kitsap County. We traveled full circle. Performing at Gateway Fellowship brought KCMT back to the same spot from which we were commissioned.

Dance instructor, Lily Bair joined our volunteer ranks in 2022. She has worked as an advisor to our Choreography Team. Lily's influence has contributed to our Chorus and Dancers learning to move precisely together with Broadway character.

After Annie, we jumped right into auditions for High School Musical under the direction of Karen Trostad. Karen has been a treasured asset to KCMT for the past thirteen years. She quickly became our Artistic Designer and Administrative Assistant. She is also our Set Designer and Backstage Director. Karen is a pillar at KCMT as a production Director and Designer. Due to Karen's gifting and experience in administration and direction, *High School Musical* was a huge success, performed on KCMT's summer stage at Restoration Ranch. Karen also spends many hours before, during and after rehearsals making sure the scenery at KCMT is top notch and extraordinary. *High School Musical* was no exception.

From beginning to end, *High School Musical* was an inspiring experience for the actors, volunteers and audience as they emerged from COVID.

Shauna spends countless hours planning the music and teaching our cast members to sound better than ever for a most rewarding educational experience in the art of singing. Shauna is also our Associate Production Director. Each one of the scenes she works on is exquisitely detailed and the youth enjoy working with her.

Our 150 parent volunteers pour themselves into creating a safe and outstanding encounter for each youth involved. They are supportive and work tirelessly ensuring the best Broadway experience possible using their unique gifts and knowledge.



#### ANNUAL Summary



The year 2022 brought three lively and successful productions for KCMT. The New Year started off in January, "Annie" performed at Gateway Fellowship. With equal measures of pluck and positivity, little orphan Annie – who had certainly lived a "Hard Knock Life" – charmed everyone's hearts!

Auditions came soon afterward, as Troy and Gabriella showed us all how to be, "All in This Together" for "High School Musical" in June in our outdoor venue at the Ranch.

KCMT wrapped up 2022 in November by a long-awaited return to the North Kitsap Auditorium for "Elf the Musical!" Buddy and the cast encouraged us all to find our "inner elf" and be determined to be "Sparklejollytwinklejingley" all the time!

These three Broadway-style productions featured between 88 to 112 cast members (ranging in age from 6 to 18 years-old), performed to several sold-out audiences and earned numerous standing ovations.

The annual Summer Camps, led by Danika Logdahl and Kyle Clearwater, was once again a highlight for the community while children experienced a week of fun and creativity while learning about musical theatre.

#### ROYAL ROBE

KCMT has a special tradition of awarding the Royal Robe to one cast member who is nominated and voted on by his or her cast mates for each production. Receiving the Royal Robe is KCMT's highest honor. The Royal Robe is awarded to the person who is always kind and gentle to everyone. 
### COMMUNITY **IMPACT**

COMMUNITY FISHLINE & ROYAL FAMILY KIDS



In 2022, not only did KCMT host three "Fishline" Benefit Nights" inviting 150 North Kitsap Fishline beneficiaries to attend a performance at no cost, but KCMT donated over 120 pounds of food to North Kitsap Fishline, an organization that provides food, emergency services, and resources to people in need. KCMT also donated \$9,500 to Royal Family Kids, an organization that provides foster children with a week of summer camp where they are treated like royalty.


